ANSWER:

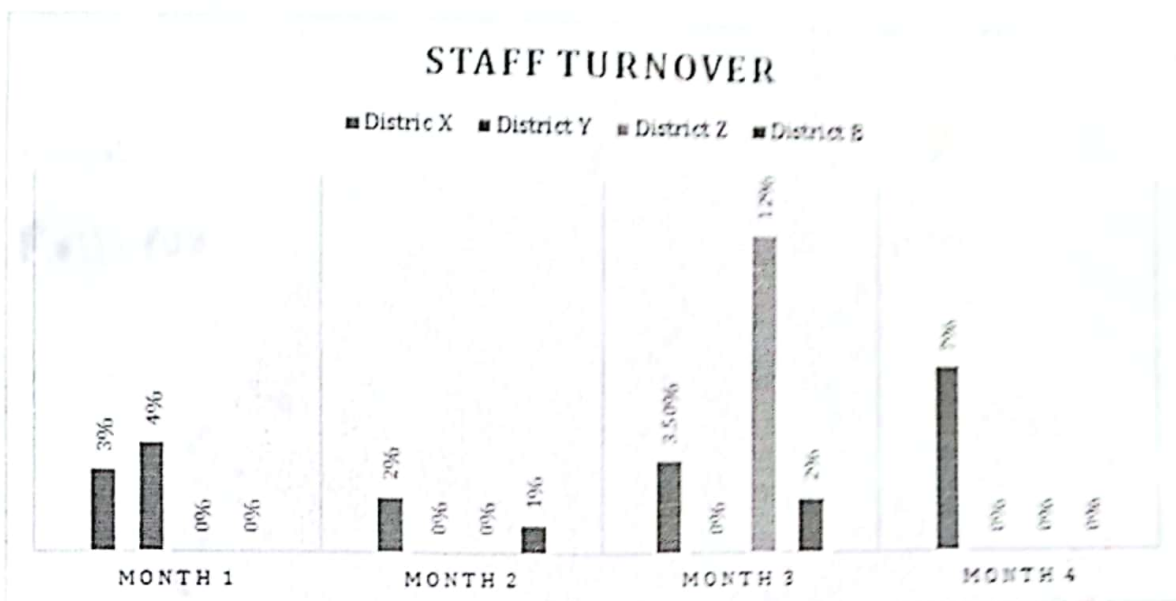
Sitting with the staff involved in vaccination. Interviewing them and enquiring from them about the turnover problem and possible solutions in this regard.

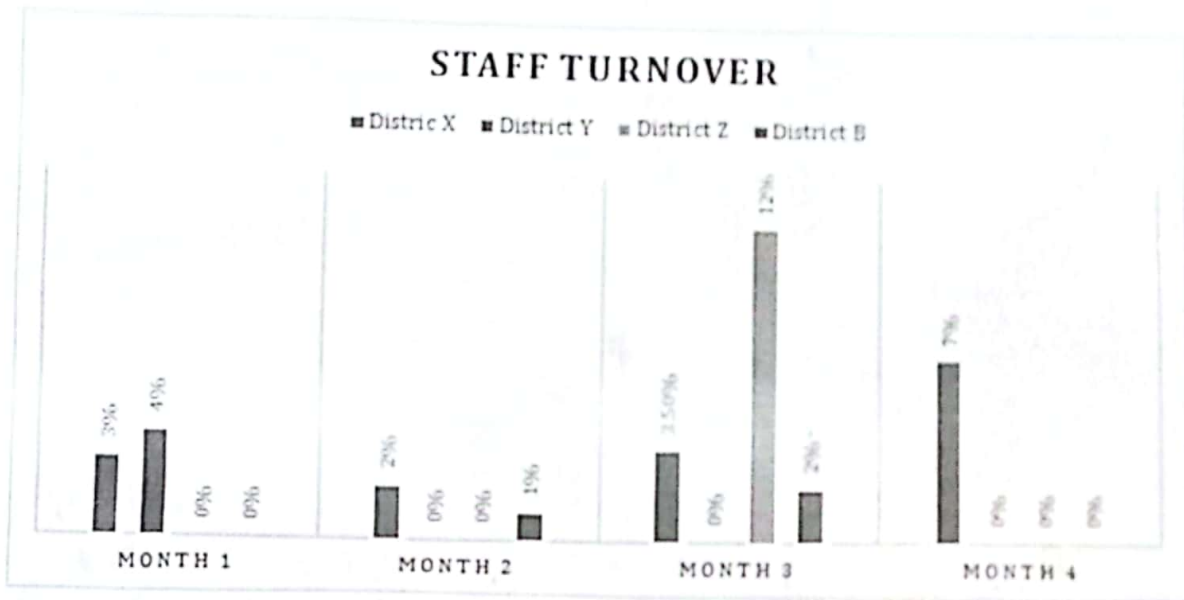

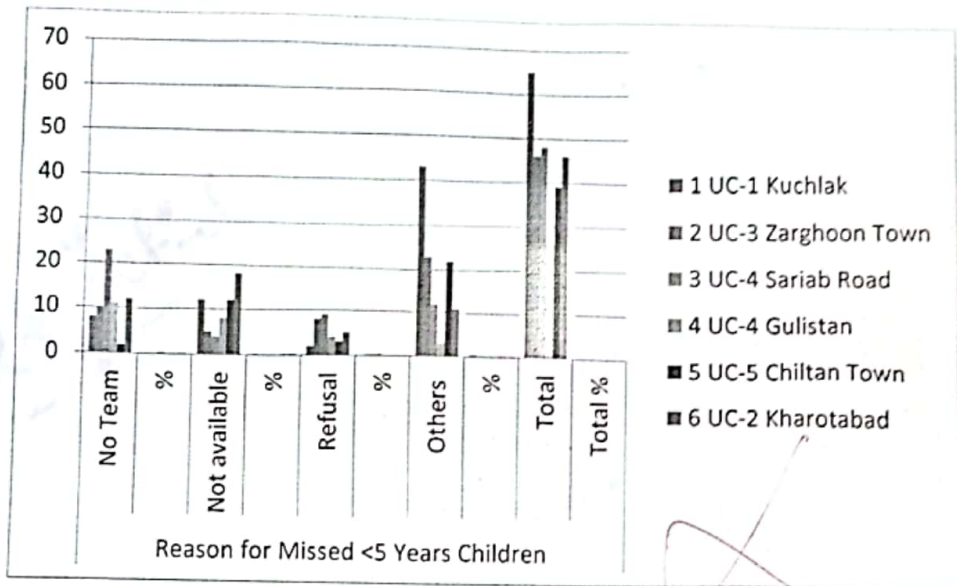
