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PNPSS

Ans: There are four pillars to eradicate Polio.

- ① Routine Immunization: it is the most important part to eradicate polio because each child of age less than two years are recorded and vaccinated in EPI centers or on and reach activity in which they get polio vaccine with 1st Three doses.
- ② mop-up: This activity is conducted when a case occur in the specific area.
- ③ Surveillance: by strengthening the AFP surveillance we can eradicate polio.
- ④ SIA's: Properly conducting SIA's (Sub Immunization Activity) and vaccinating more than 95% of children we can eradicate polio.
